





New-look squad will be led by veteran

PARAMUS - Jimmy Suess once was a somewhat unsuccessful 189-pound freshman wrestler. Now he's a burgeoning success as a 140-pound senior at Paramus High School. Yes, that's 49 pounds he's dropped while becoming a grappler to watch this season.

"Jimmy's put in a lot of hard work, and he just looks like a different person," head coach Steve Klass said. "He used to be chubby, but he has muscles now and no fat."

wears a varsity Seuss the weights at which he has competed in his career - 189, 171, 145, 140.

"People think that's in the wrong order, since kids' weights usually go up," Klass said with a laugh. "But that really is the right [chronological] order. He's easy kid to root for."

Klass led the North Jersey Wrestling Team of the Year last season, as voted by The Record is extremely young. Still, he has year. high hopes for late-season sucalready been surprised by their readiness to compete, though.

"We have 10 or 11 new kids, but we beat Seton Hall Prep unexpectedly," he said. "[Before that,] we finished seventh of eight teams in the Caldwell Tournament, but I was pleased with the way we wrestled because it's a tournament that has a lot of state-ranked teams."

The Spartans had two champions at Caldwell, Joe Rizzitello and Nick Alpher.

The following is the coach's rundown of the weight classes:

103: Hard-working freshman Eric Giannantonio has broken into the lineup and took fifth in the Caldwell Tournament.

112: Sophomore Danny Melon, who missed half of last season with a concussion, is healthy again.

119: "We're not sure who will be the starter here," Klass said.
"We have three kids fighting for it, and they're all ninth- and 10th-graders.

125: Junior Tarek Jerai started wrestling jacket that indicates for the varsity as a freshman, but was not a regular last year. He finished fourth at Caldwell in his

130: Senior Joe Rizzitello was a district champion and finished at the fifth/sixth level of the Region 2 Tournament. He opened this season with a chama great kid, and he's really an pionship in the Caldwell Tournament.

135: Sophomore Nick Spinoso is embarking on his first varsity season, but he was a Bergen sports staff, but this year's squad County freshman champion last

140: The inspirational Seuss cess as the kids mature. He's battled a state qualifier, sincegraduated Anthony Melon, in the Paramus wrestling room last year and won a few of their bouts. In the brawl to make the lineup for the district tournament, he lost a squeaker to Melon in double overtime. Suess took a third at Caldwell.

145: Senior Nick Alpher is the top returnee. He notched 40 wins last year along with county and district championships and second place in the region. He opened this season by recording his 100th career victory in the first round at Caldwell and decisioned Randolph's Kevin Collins, 1-0, for the title there. "He had five state qualifiers in his weight class and won it," Klass said. "You don't often see so many qualifiers in one weight in a tournament. We're looking to get him a state medal this year.

152: Junior Dave Arrighi and sophomore Brandon LoPresti are competing here. Arrighi actually finished sixth at Caldwell, down at 135 pounds. "It goes back and forth, and they're good kids," the coach said. "It's good to have competition in the room, and it should make both kids better."

160: Sophomore Mustafa Aslami, a first-year varsity wrestler, seems to have benefited from a summer dedicated to the sport.

171: Sophomore Matt Tozzi was a county freshman champion and is referred to as one of the team's hardest workers. He took a fifth at Caldwell.

189: Senior Mike Sebahie broke in midway through last season and took a district fourth. He took second in the Caldwell Tournament.

215: Senior Lukas Sahdo is in just his second season of wrestling, but has promise.

285: Sophomore Mike Aydin debuts on the varsity weighing about 215 pounds. "He has a great attitude, and, by mid-year, he should be competitive," Klass

"We have a tough schedule, but I'll take these kids against anybody," Klass summarized. "It's refreshing to have a bunch of hungry kids. They may take their lumps, but they'll be all the better for it. There's a lot of potential, and they'll just keep getting better and better."

Nicholas Alpher doesn't know what he wants to do five years from now. The star wrestler from Paramus doesn't even know which weight class he should compete at the rest of this season. All Alpher knows is no matter where he is or what he's doing, he wants to be great.

That mentality has worked well so far.
"I like variety," Alpher said. "I have ideas about what I want to do in the future, because every other day it's something different. No matter what I do, I want to succeed in it."

It's that thought process that has taken Alpher to great heights. He has 121 career wins and needs nine more to become the all-time leader in the long and distinguished history of Paramus wrestling.

Last week, the senior went 4-0, including a win over Bergen County champion Johnny Sebastian, to bring his season record to 22-1. He earned The Record Male Athlete of the Week honor.

The biggest question facing Alpher is which weight class he should choose. He started at 145, where he suffered his only loss in the County final, but has been at 152 this month.

Alpher said he feels comfortable at 152 and still is deciding whether to drop to his original weight for a run at a State title. He won't make his decision until the district tournaments begin in February, and he'll make it based on what offers him the best chance in the long run.


"I'm still kind of confused about what I want to do," Alpher said. "It's all about where I feel comfortable and where I feel my best chance at competing is."

Alpher will take that mentality to college, but he's unsure of which one to attend. He wants to stay in the tri-state area and applied only to schools in the region.

Which major will he chose? Alpher isn't sure. He

just knows he wants to succeed.

Alpher unravels opponent to win 'MOW' award

BY BRIAN FARRELL Sports Editor RAMSEY – About seven years ago, the state athletic association changed how a high school wrestling match would unfold. Many felt it was unfair to have the result of a close match always hinge on the heavyweight bout, or the one at 215 pounds, as a dual meet would always be contested in chronological order of weight class. 

No doubt about it, considering the two standout wrestlers' previous four entanglements: 2009 county title won by Alpher, 2010 Region 2 title won by Alpher, 2010 Region 2 title won by Mastriani, 2010 county title won by Mastriani

So, when the 152-pound weight class was chosen from the hat to be the first bout of the District 5 finals, many in attendance at Don Bosco Prep were left to wonder that Providence, not coincidence, was involved in making the battle for the championship at 145 pounds between Alpher and Mastriani the last match of the day, as all marques fights should be, whether it's boxing or wrestling.

"The weights that were in the hat, I think, were all 152," Alpher jokingly said later, speaking as a District 5 champion via his 3-1 victory over Mastriani.

Last year, Alpher won a 3-2 decision over Mastriani to claim the district crown at 140 pounds.
