



SPECIAL AWARD CLASS OF 1971


Jim is a graduate of Paramus High School class of 1971. He was married to the late Renee Marano PHS class of 1971. Jim is a lifelong resident of Paramus, his parents Myrtle and James Jr. moving there in 1952 after James Jr. was honorably discharged from the US Navy after serving in World War II and the Korean War. Jim has a younger brother Richard P. Tedesco who is a 1972 PHS graduate and a US Army Veteran.

Jim went to Farview Elementary School, Eastbrook Jr. High School where he developed many long time friendships that carry on today. At PHS Jim played three sports, Football, Basketball and Baseball for all three years and was proud to be part of the 1969 NNJIL Co-Championship Football Team.

After graduating PHS, Jim started his professional career working at PSE&G for thirty-six and a half years, becoming the General Manager of Large Customer Support.


Following the example set by his parents, Jim has always been committed to public service. In 1976, Jim joined the Paramus Fire Department, where he has been a Volunteer Firefighter for more than 43 years and elected Fire Chief twice. Starting in 2000, Jim served on the Paramus Borough Council and then as Mayor of his hometown for two terms. His service also extended to holding several community volunteer leadership positions with emergency management, youth sports, and non-profits.

As Mayor, Jim worked with the Paramus Board of Education to expand shared services between the Borough and the BOE. With his leadership, the Borough completely transformed the Parkway School ballfields into a multi-functional Sports facility that includes two full size soccer/lacrosse



fields, a soccer field for recreation play, two baseball fields and permanent comfort stations and snack stand. Along with the changes at Parkway, the East Brook Middle School old football field was refurbished and converted to a soccer field. Converting the PHS football field to an all turf multi use field is one of Jim's proudest accomplishments. In 2009, the PHS football field was transformed from natural grass to an all turf field. Not only was Jim instrumental in the successful completion of the grass to turf field conversion, he developed





the 1.5 million dollar funding plan for the project that included funding from both the BOE and the Borough of Paramus and \$350,000 of Bergen County Open Space Trust funds. All this was accomplished while fighting many political detractors and those with self-interests. The stadium field is now used by most PHS sports teams, for band competitions, as a state playoff site and Paramus Recreation sports.


James J. Tedesco, III began serving his second term as the Bergen County Executive on January 1, 2019. Since taking office in 2015, County Executive Tedesco has focused on improving the quality of life and services for its nearly one million county residents while also creating greater efficiency and effectiveness throughout county government.

Under Tedesco's leadership, Bergen County was recognized by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) as the first county in New Jersey to end homelessness among Veterans. As a longtime supporter of Bergen Community College, Tedesco

restored millions in education funding to the college since 2015. Tedesco secured the future for the county's hospital, Bergen New Bridge Medical Center (New Jersey's largest hospital and the fourth largest publicly owned hospital in the nation), increasing services for U.S.

military veterans and their families while continuing its mission as a safety net hospital for thousands. Tedesco is also committed to preserving open space and enhancing the nearly 10,000 acres of Park Land and recreational facilities within our Bergen County Parks System.

Jim has three adult children, Koren (1994), James J. Tedesco IV (1996), and Holly (2001), who share his commitment to public service as a community swim instructor, a FDNY firefighter, and Paramus council member, respectively. He hopes that his six grandchildren (Alex, William, Haley, Andrew, Brynn, Bryce) will continue the family tradition and seek the opportunity to serve as well. Jim continues to live in Paramus with his girlfriend Connie Salimbeno.





R STANTON BAUER CLASS OF 1960


Stan is one of the finest athletes to participate in Paramus High School sports. His contributions to PHS athletics set the standard for all athletes that have followed.

While earning nine Varsity letters, three each in football, basketball, and baseball, Stan contributed tremendously to PHS sports legacy. In

football, he was team captain and earned All-County recognition as a linebacker. Even more impressive, he kicked the longest punt in PHS football history.

In baseball, his four years on Varsity were fruitful as he rose to captain earning All-County honors as a catcher. As a three year veteran in basketball, he was also named captain of the Varsity team.

In addition to his sports endeavors, Stan held the position of President of Student Council for 1959 and 1960. After PHS, Stan attended Rutgers University and endeavored to continue his love of sports, playing both football and baseball but a knee injury, unfortunately, forced him to stop. Through R.O.T.C, he served as First Lieutenant and was also President of the Beta Theta Pi Fraternity.



In his career, Stan has risen from salesman to Senior Vice President of

various companies including, American Can, Thatcher Glass Company, RKO, BASF, and Fuji Film (from which is retired 2005). He also served as Chairman of I.T.A. (Trade Association)

Stan currently lives in Upper Saddle River, NJ with his wife fellow PHS alumnus Susan (Forrester) '61, together they have one son.









CHARLES (CHUCK) PRICE CLASS OF 1963

Chuck Price made outstanding contributions to the legacy of the Paramus High School Boys Varsity Soccer program.


He earned three letters for soccer and numerous accolades during his tenure, including a record holding the most PHS soccer goal assists for a number of years. He earned All-County Honorable Mention, 2nd Team, and 1st Team during his sophomore through senior years

respectively. He was All-NNJIL 2nd Team (Junior year), and 1st Team (Senior year), while also earning

All-State recognition (Honorable Mention) during his last two years at PHS. During his Junior year, as the starting left wing, the soccer team made it to the 1961 NJ/Group 3 Championship and lost with honor during a double overtime game against Summit High School with a final score of 2-1.

Chuck also played baseball and basketball, earning a couple more letters during his time. He had the privilege to be mentored by great coaches such as Ernie Unger, Bob Kingsley, and Herb Hoeland.

Academically, Chuck was a member of the Honor Society his senior year and served as the President of the Student Council. He was a Boys' State attendee (1 of 2 selected from PHS) during his senior year and spent time as Student Conductor and trumpet/1st chair during his Junior and Senior years.



Upon graduating PHS, Chuck went on to Muhlenberg College to earn a Bachelor's Degree in History (1967). He continued his soccer endeavors as a four-year starter on the Division III varsity team and was named co-captain his senior year. He held the record for assists at the college until the 1970s and was selected to the all-PA/MD/DE soccer team in 1966. With these great accomplishments in tow, he was invited to attend the US Olympic Soccer Team tryouts in 1967. At Muhlenberg, in addition to soccer, he took on lacrosse and played two years with their varsity lacrosse team.

Chuck has since spent 42.5 years working in the Defense Intelligence Agency, retiring as a Senior Operations Officer in 2010. Fittingly, and continuing with his passion for soccer, Chuck served as head coach for his daughters' travel and high school soccer teams for about 15 years.

Chuck lives in Gaithersburg, MD and is happily married to his wife, Elaine. His two daughters (Rebecca and Cynthia) have also blessed him with 6 grandchildren and one due as this was going to press!

Lenny was a remarkable multi-sport athlete at Paramus High School.


He earned six letters in both football and wrestling during his Sophomore through Senior years, and was a member of the Lettermen's Club for those years as well.


Lenny's enjoyed numerous accomplishments in both sports. He earned 1st Team All-County, 1st Team All-Suburban, 1st Team All-

KEN MAXWELL CLASS OF 1975

Deceased (1990 at the age of 33)

Ken was an overall tremendous talent and standout athlete at Paramus High School, in football, indoor track, and outdoor track.


In football, as a running back, he held the PHS record for single season rushing yards with 1,122 yards. This record was held for 36 years, from 1974 until it was broken in 2010. Ken also led the football team to historic

upsets and impressive victories over unbeaten Hackensack, Wayne Valley,

and Bergenfield. He was named All-League, All-Suburban, All-Area, and earned as spot on the Bergen-Passaic All-Star Team.

In track, Ken excelled as a sprinter. Running in sprint doubles, he helped the Spartans win back-to-back NNJIL Championships in 1974 and 1975. He still holds a spot as one of the Top 10 All-time 220 yard performances with a time of 22.5 seconds. He was a member of the current school record holding 880 yard relay team and the current school record holding spring medley team.

He is remembered as a great teammate, a gifted athlete, and a strong-hearted individual. He is survived by his sister, Diane Wagner.









PAUL BARNES CLASS OF 1975

Few people have impacted Paramus High School sports in more ways than Paul Barnes as an athlete, teacher, and coach.

As a student-athlete, Paul played multiple sports and earned eight letters out of a possible nine. He earned two in football as a defensive back and tight end, three in Basketball as a guard, and three in Baseball as pitcher, 3rd baseman, and outfielder. Paul was named Captain of the Baseball and Basketball teams his Senior year.

In Baseball, he secured All-Suburban honors for three years (1973-1975), All-League in 1974 and 1975, and All-Bergen his senior year in 1975. He

was also named Male Athlete of the Year in 1975, voted by the Coaching Staff.


After PHS, Paul continued playing Baseball at Springfield College, secured three Varsity letters as a pitcher, and was named Athlete of the Month in April 1979. He studied Physical Education and Minored in Mathematics. After his undergraduate years, he went on to receive at Master's in Mathematics at Fairleigh Dickinson University.

Paul continued his dedication to Paramus High School by becoming a Mathematics teacher. He spent 34 years teaching, starting in 1984 until retirement in 2018. During that time, he coached six different sports and held more head coaching positions than any other teacher or coach in the more than 60 year sports history of Paramus High School. He was the Head Coach of the Golf, Volleyball, Softball, and Boys Basketball



Teams, while also assisting the Baseball and Football teams for various years. Many of his teams secured several championships, ranging from League to County to State Sectional Championship. He has coached several Hall of Fame Athletes and holds an amazing coaching record, with a remarkable 796 wins and 298 losses.

Paul lives in Paramus with his wife, Maria. Together they have two adult sons who were both athletes, Tom (a Fairleigh Dickinson graduate) and Tim (a Georgetown graduate).









LOUISE TALAREK-O'DONNELL CLASS OF 1980

Louise was an exceptional student-athlete during her time at Paramus High School and continues her love of sports even to this day.

Louise earned six letters in basketball and softball combined. As pitcher for the varsity softball team, however, she really left her impression on PHS. Earning accolades as early as sophomore year, she was named honorable mention NNJIL and 2nd Team All-Suburban. By Junior year, she held a

record of 11-5, 1.5 ERA and batted .375 and led her team to a league championship; not to mention, having several big games (one no-hitter, three one-hitters, and two two-hitters). She struck out 11 batters three times during the season and collected 1st Team All-NNJIL League, 1st Team All-Suburban, and Honorable Mention All-County.

Perhaps even more impressively, her Senior year proved even more outstanding as she batted .443, team record 21-4, and an ERA of .90 while leading the team once again to a league championship and 2nd place in the state tournament. The awards were numerous again; 1st Team All-NNJIL, 1st Team All-County, 1st Team All-State. Throughout her senior year she traveled to over 23 states playing in national tournaments.

Louise's time playing basketball helped her earn honorable mention NNJIL for two years, as well as 1st Team All-Suburban while leading the league in rebounds during her three years.

Louise currently travels throughout the country for softball and has played Women's USSSA Softball for the NJ Gems for over 20 years. They have won 2 State Championships and came in 6th in the World Tournament. She also plays for three senior teams and has thrived throughout it all earning MVP awards, being named All-Tournament, All-American, and winning two Gold Medals and two Silver medals in National games.

Louise graduated from Rutgers University with a Bachelor of Science degree. Her husband of 27 years, Chuck, has been a tremendous supporter of her softball career. Together they have four children, 6 grandchildren and one grandchild due in March of next year. Louise lives in Corbin City, NJ, and is a retired teacher of agriculture and a retired business owner.







LARRY GOODMAN CLASS OF 1985


Larry was an outstanding wrestler and left an indelible mark on the Paramus High School Wrestling Team.




Earning four letters in basketball, she also rose to the position of captain during her senior year. During her senior year, Staci also earned a varsity letter in soccer playing goalie.

Koren was an exceptional swimmer throughout her youth, and particularly during her time at Paramus High School.

Starting even before her time at PHS, Koren swam as a United States Swimming Jr. National Qualifier in the 200, 500, 1000 and 1650 yard freestyle events, and the 400 yard Individual Medley. During her high school years, she continued her strides as a National Qualifier in all of those aforementioned events, and claimed numerous medals throughout those national championship meets. She was twice selected as one of 32 girls to attend the United States Swimming Select Camp at the Olympic

Training Center in Colorado Springs and held national top 10 rankings in those 6 individual events along with the 800 freestyle relay.

During her Freshman year she received the National Interscholastic Swimming Coaches Association Award for PHS, as well as being named State Top 12 and Zone Top 16 in the 200 and 500 yard freestyle. As as a Sophomore, she continued to excel and place on the podium at Nationals, as well as qualify for 1992 Olympic Trials in the 1650/1500 Free. She was named the Bergen Record's Runner-up Athlete of the week, and won the 200 Free and 500 Free at the New Jersey State High School Championships representing Paramus High School. As a Junior, she received the designation as a National Scholastic All-American in the 500 free for Paramus High School. During her Senior Year. in addition to attending Junior and Senior Nationals she qualified for the US Open Swimming Championship in Ann Arbor, MI. She placed 7th in the 200 free and 8th in the 500 free at the New Jersey State High School Championships.



JONATHAN RIZZITELLO CLASS OF 2008


Jon was an incredible football player, wrestler, and student during his time at Paramus High School.


yardage (294). His endeavors earned All-League honors.




